






Hello, my name is Terry Best. I live with my dad, my sister Eileen and my dog Sparkie.

These are my friends Michael and Davey. They are Travellers and they live in a caravan.





We live in a village. There is not much to do in the evenings. We sometimes get into trouble for skateboarding or playing football in front of the shop.



One day some youth workers from the next town arrange to come and see us. They want to know what it is like living in the village. They tell us that with our help they can make decisions about things for us to do in the village.

I say that there is nothing to do when we get back from school.

Michael says that we have nowhere to play when it rains or when it is cold.

The youth workers ask if we want to go to a meeting to make things better in the village.



The youth workers ask us when we want the meeting.

We can't do it on Mondays or Wednesdays because I help look after my sister Eileen and Davey and Michael sometimes go on a trip in the van with their family. So we decide Tuesday night is best.

The youth worker says he will look at all our ideas and see what he can do.



We get a message saying there is some money to help us make our ideas happen.

The youth workers from the town help us to set up a computer room at the village club. They make sure that it will be open in the evenings and that there is someone to help us.

We now have somewhere to go in the evenings when it rains. It's great fun! We play computer games and use the internet.



There is also enough money to build something. We have lots of ideas for a skate park but we know that there is not enough money for all the things we want!

We decide that the main thing we want is a big ramp and we make drawings of what it should look like.

We are given sports vouchers as a thank you. I am going to buy a new skateboard with mine!






