

Have you been treated unfairly in employment, in education or accessing goods and services because you are an Irish Traveller?


For example:

- **Have you been turned away from a hotel, club, shop or bar,**
- **Have you been denied access to a job,**
- **Have you been subjected to jokes, teasing or name calling at work,**

because you are an Irish Traveller?

If so, you may have the right to make a complaint to an industrial tribunal or a county court.



A part of race law in Northern Ireland identifies Irish Travellers as a specific race for the purposes of protection from racial discrimination.

Therefore it is illegal in Northern Ireland for you to be discriminated against because you are an Irish Traveller.

If you feel you have been discriminated against because you are an Irish Traveller the Equality Commission for Northern Ireland gives free and confidential advice on making a complaint of discrimination including the time limits involved.
